

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INTRODUCTION

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Rajiv Gandhi Arts and Science College is situated in **Thavalakuppam**, a rural area nearly about 11 kms away from the town limit of Puducherry. It is almost the centre of axis between Puducherry and Cuddalore (Tamil Nadu). Having a glimpse at the history of the inception of the college, it is known that it got established as the Annexe of the age-old glorious institution, **Tagore Arts College** that was **founded** by the then **Honorable Prime Minister of India, Shri. Jawaharlal Nehru,** and later separated from it with a new name to exist on its own now.

On March 2007, the amalgamation of UTPASTICS with the Union Territory of Pondicherry Colleges of Education Society was made thus, emerged a new formation by the name Pondicherry Society for Higher Education (PONSHE). Registered under the society act 1860 (Act No. XXI of 1860) with the registration number 397/2007. His Excellency, the Lt. Governor of Puducherry accorded the approval to the college to function under the name "Rajiv Gandhi Arts and Science College" and thereafter, the college functions with all eminence for the growth of rural population.

Initially, the college functioned with two courses viz. **B.Com.** (General) and **B.Com.** (Co-operative Management) with intake of 30 students in each. During the year 2010, the number of seats in these two courses increased to 40 in each, and also provision for accommodation of three more courses were laid. Thus, Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.), Bachelor of Computer Science (B.Sc. Computer Science) and Bachelor of Computer Applications (B.C.A.) emerged with an intake of 30 students in each.

It has now become the centre for Higher Education to the rural population with an ambitious remark and distinct characteristics inculcating socio-economical, moral and human values to the students apart from teaching curriculum. The college is located in the center of the rural area of Puducherry on a sprawling campus of **five acres.** It is in prime location for the rural genders, to have their higher education programs successfully, with an easy access to mobility.

This College is affiliated to Pondicherry University, offering 5 UG courses in Arts and Science disciplines. The Centre made a paradigm shift in the curriculum adopting Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) during 2017–18 for all UG programmes.

The institution has developed the students' strength to **747** through a common admission programme called **CENTAC** (Centralized Admission Committee for Arts and Science Courses) by the Government of Puducherry. Job opportunities are highlighted through the Career Guidance and Counseling Cell of the college that plays a significant role in

showing up the opportunities available in the market and help the students to avail it. To create and develop the personality of the students with the society and community to live with, **N.C.C.**, **N.S.S.** and **R.R.C.** were started in this college. The college has a hierarchy committed towards the development of higher education under the concept "Education for All".

The Secretary to the Government (Education) functions as the Chairman of the Society Colleges run by the Government of Puducherry. The Director, Directorate of Higher & Technical Education, as Member Secretary, contributes for the overall functioning of the Pondicherry Society for Higher Education. The Principal administers the college with the functioning of faculty and non-teaching staff to cater the needs through Higher Education to the rural population. The vision and mission of the college depicts the importance of why and how it was framed for the complete development of rural folks through Higher Education.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

(I – Year & II – Year Students)

The following regulations for effective implementation of CBCS at the Under-graduate (UG) level in Arts, Science, and Commerce are adopted as per guidelines prescribed by UGC.

DEFINITIONS OF KEYWORDS

- 1. **Programme**: An educational program leading to award of a degree/ diploma/ certificate.
- 2. **Programme Committee**: Each Program of Study shall have a Programme Committee to oversee implementation of the program.
- 3. **Course**: Usually a course referred to as 'subject' is a component of the Programme of Study. All courses need not carry the same weight. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/tutorials/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/vocational training/viva/seminars/term papers/assignments/presentations/self-study etc., or a combination of some of these.
- 4. **Core Course**: The Core Courses in all the semesters shall be compulsorily studied by a student.
- 5. **Elective Course**: Elective Course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of papers. It may be:
 - Supportive to the discipline of study
 - Providing an expanded scope
 - ❖ Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain
 - Nurturing student's proficiency/skill.

An elective may be "Generic Elective" focusing on those courses which add generic proficiency to the students. An elective may be "Discipline Centric" or may be chosen from an unrelated discipline. It may be called an "Open Elective."

6. Foundation Course: The Foundation Courses may be of two kinds: Compulsory Foundation and Elective foundation. "Compulsory Foundation" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They are mandatory for all disciplines. Elective Foundation courses are value-based and are aimed at providing ethical and humanistic education.

- 7. **Repeat Course:** If a student gets (i) less than 40% in the internal assessment and fails in the course or (ii) fails to get the required attendance, the student shall repeat the course when offered.
- 8. **Choice Based Credit System** (CBCS): The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses etc.). Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a degree / diploma / certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.
- 9. **Credit**: It is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
- 10.**Letter Grade**: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F.
- 11.**Grade Point**: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- 12.**Credit Point**: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- 13. **Semester Grade Point Average** (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. SGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- 14. **Cumulative Grade Point Average** (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.
- 15. **Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate**: Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.
- 16.**Academic Year:** Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one Academic year.
- 17.**Semester**: Each semester will consist of 15–18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.

PATTERN OF EXAMINATION

- 1. The End-Semester examination for each course in a Programme of Study shall be conducted by the Pondicherry University for a maximum of **75 marks** and Internal Continuous Assessment for **25 marks**.
- 2. Internal assessment for all theory courses shall be done on the basis of at least two Internal Assessment tests (15 marks), term papers/assignments/seminars/case demonstrations/ presentations/ write-ups/viva etc. (5 marks) and attendance (5 marks). The following weightage shall be given to attendance:

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95% – 100% (5 marks)
90% – 94% (4 marks)
85% – 89% (3 marks)
80% – 84% (2 marks)
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75% – 79% (1 mark)

- 3. Internal Assessment for practical courses involving Laboratory/Field work/Project work, appropriate distribution of marks for Practical Record/Project Report, Practical end-semester exam, Viva shall be decided by the BOS.
- 4. A schedule of Internal Assessment tests shall be prepared by each College commonly to all departments in the beginning of each semester. Internal Assessment marks shall be displayed a week before the commencement of end-semester examinations.
- 5. End-semester examination shall be conducted for all courses offered. The duration of the end-semester examination shall be 3 hours.
- 6. Every student has to pay examination fee per Credit basis as fixed by the University.
- 7. A schedule of end–semester examinations will be prepared and displayed by the University much in advance.
- 8. No student with less than 75% attendance in any particular course shall be permitted to attend the end-semester examination and shall be given grade FA-failure due to lack of attendance. However, an overall condonation of 10% attendance (65% to 75%) is permitted for valid reasons (NCC, NSS, Swachh Bharat or medical reasons) with valid medical certificate may be permitted to write the end semester examination after the payment of Condonation Fee prescribed by the University.
- 9. Students with less than 65% of attendance and/or less than 40% of the Internal Assessment Marks (Less than 10 marks) should repeat the course (redo) as and when offered.
- 10.A student who has been awarded FA shall repeat the course when offered. The Principal/Head of the Department shall ensure that the candidate is informed about the lack of attendance before the commencement of end-semester examination and confirm that such candidates are not permitted to write the examination.
- 11.To pass a course the student must secure minimum of 40 out of 100 marks (40%) in the internal and the end-semester examination put together.

- 12. A student who has earned the required number of 120 credits by clearing all the required courses shall be declared as pass even if he/she could not clear optional courses which were taken in excess of the required number of courses
- 13. Result Passing Board for each Programme of Study shall be constituted by the Pondicherry University from time to time
- 14. Revaluation and re-totaling of the answer scripts shall be allowed within the stipulated period of time as decided by the Controller of Examinations (COE) after paying the required amount of fee
- 15. Malpractice, if any, committed by the students in the University exam will be dealt with as per XV (A) of the Academic Ordinances of Pondicherry University. Pondicherry University website may be referred for further information in this regard.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

- 1. A failed student who meets the attendance requirement may be permitted to register for the next end–semester examination in the following semester itself.
- 2. Students who have failed due to insufficient attendance and/or less than 40% Internal Assessment marks should repeat (redo) the course as and when offered.

GRADING AND GRADE CARD

1. Letter grades shall be used to assess the performance of students in each course by converting final marks (out of 100) into grades. In case of fractions the marks shall be rounded off to next integer. The following shall be used to convert marks into awarding grades:

- 2. The SGPA shall also be calculated by taking all courses taken by the student in the semester and CGPA shall also be calculated by taking all the courses taken by the student in all the semesters (refer 16and 17).
- 3. The University shall award "class" to students who acquired 120 credits (or as prescribed by BOS, see 5.6) according to the following:

CGPA	Class
9.00 – 10.00	First Class with Distinction (should not have failed in any course)
7.00 – 8.99	First Class
5.50 – 6.99	Second Class
4.00 – 5.49	Pass

4. The Grade card shall be issued to the students containing grades obtained by the student in the previous semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

The Grade card shall list the following:

- a. Title of the course taken by the student
- b. Number of credits allotted to the course
- c. The grades secured by the student in each course
- d. Total number of credits earned by the student in that semester
- e. SGPA of the student
- f. Total number of credits earned by the student till that semester
- g. CGPA of the student

COMPUTATION OF SGPA AND CGPA

Following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be followed:

1. The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student,

i.e.,
$$SGPA(S_i) = \sum_{i} (C_i \times G_i) / \sum_{i} C_i$$

where C_i is the number of credits of the ith course

 G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.

2. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme,

i.e.,
$$CGPA = \sum (C_i \times S_i) / \sum C_i$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the ith semester

 C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

3. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE (III Year)

- 1. A student goes on leave he/she should give the leave application to the concerned Head of the Department on his/her first day of return. The leave letter should be signed by parent/guardian. If his/her leave exceeds three days he/she should produce a medical certificate along with the leave letter.
- 2. If a student absents himself/herself for four weeks continuously without leave letter his/her name will be removed from the rolls.
- 3. Students who represent the college in sports, games or in competitions such as Fine Arts, Quiz, NSS/NCC camps etc., should get prior permission from the HOD to participate in the same. Those who fail to do so will be considered as absentees.
- 4. The annual certificate of attendance required by the University for admission to the University examinations will be issued only on satisfying the following conditions:
 - a. The conduct and progress of the student has been satisfactory.
 - b. The student should have a minimum of 75% of attendance in all the theory papers taken in a semester and 90% attendance in all practical classes.
 - c. No individual warning will be issued to the student regarding the shortage of attendance. However percentage of attendance scored by the student will be bulletined every month.
 - d. In case of less than 75% and up to 65% of attendance in theory classes, with valid medical certificate may be permitted to apply for the University Examination on payment of the Condonation Fee at the discretion of the Principal. This condonation will be recommended only once during the entire duration of study.
 - e. Students with less than 65% of attendance in theory classes will not be permitted to appear for the University Examination.

CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

- 1. All the students must attend the College decently dressed. Tight garments such as Jeans, T shirts etc., must be avoided.
- 2. The possession of ID card in the college premises at all times is a must.
- 3. At the first bell, announcing the commencement of the session (9.55 a.m. and 01.25 p.m.) students should be seated in their respective seats.
- 4. Every student must obey the teacher and respectfully carry out their instructions. The students shall observe politeness towards the non-teaching staff of the College and behave decorously with his / her fellow students.
- 5. No student shall leave the classroom or laboratory without the teacher's permission. Students must observe strict silence in the classes and listen to the lectures attentively, without distracting the attention of others.
- 6. Students must move to their classrooms or laboratories at the appointed hours silently. They must also remain silent during the interval between the teacher finishing his/her class and leaving and the next teacher entering to engage the class.
- 7. Students are forbidden from talking and making any sort of noise in the form of small or large group in the corridors or vicinity of rooms where classes are in progress or otherwise disturb them in any manner.
- 8. Every student must care for every property of the College and refrain from indulging in any activity that may damage the College property. Every student to whom books or any College property are entrusted will be held responsible for their preservation in good condition and in the event of their loss they will be required to replace them or repay their cost. Any students indulging in breaking or damaging any College property will be required to pay the cost of repair or replacements. In case of willful damage he / she will be punished in such a manner, as the Director may think fit.
- 9. Students should not leave the college during the working hours. Those who feel sick must contact the Head of the Department.
- 10. Students are prohibited from organizing any meeting or entertainment in the college or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
- 11. Students guilty of going over to other colleges and institutions to take part in acts of indiscipline such as organizing distortions and strikes would be deemed especially culpable and would be punished accordingly.
- 12. Students shall not hold meetings for criticizing the conduct of the University or the college authorities. Such meetings will be deemed unlawful and the Director will take such action as he / she deems necessary to prohibit or to punish and in case she considers it very serious he / she may recommend for rustication.

13. The teasing, ragging etc. are punishable offences to the extent of summary expulsion from the College.

- 14. Consumption of alcohol and other intoxicants or narcotics in any form in the campus is strictly prohibited. Smoking inside the college premises is banned and strictly prohibited.
- 15. The possession of weapons is strictly prohibited.
- 16. The use of Cell phones is strictly prohibited inside the campus. If found, the instrument will be seized immediately.
- 17. Students are expected to read the notice / circulars put up in the notice board regularly.
- 18. No notice, which does not have the approval of the Principal, shall be circulated or displayed in the Notice board.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1. The Principal of the College shall have complete power for the maintenance of the discipline of the students of the College. He / She may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a temporary or permanent character, regulating the conduct of the students within the campus or outside the College.
- 2. The Principal shall have the power to inflict punishment including fine, loss of attendance, withhold of term certificates, suspension, expulsion and rustication.
- 3. The Principal will ordinarily place himself / herself in communication where necessary, with the parent / guardian of the students who are academically backward and who do not show any improvement and whose attendance is irregular and whose conduct is unsatisfactory. The name of the students who are found incorrigible even after several warnings may be removed from the rolls after intimation to their parents / guardians. The order of the Principal in this matter shall be final.
- 4. Students of the college going on strike, in any way indulge in acts of indiscipline that may lead to dislocation of work in the college shall immediately forfeit their scholarships, fee concessions etc., besides punishments awarded by the Principal.
- 5. Petitions or complaints from individuals or groups to any higher authorities must be submitted only through the Principal.

DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

Disciplinary actions may include:

- 1. A reprimand or warning
- 2. To call the parent and take an undertaking from the parent and the student

- 3. Depending upon the gravity of the offence, appropriate action will be taken by the Disciplinary Committee headed by the Principal as mentioned below:
 - i) When a student is continuously absent for more than 10 working days without applying leave of absence to the appropriate authority and comes with a plea and wishes to rejoin after getting dropped. For such instances Rs. 100/- is to be paid as revival fee.
 - ii) A student will be dropped from the rolls of the College:
 - a) If he/she involves in misconduct such as second attempt indulging in malpractice in a university examination, gross misbehaviour with teachers or wantonly disobeying the Principal and incidence of teasing, ragging which may not involve physical harm.
 - b) When the behaviour of the student vitiates the atmosphere of the College

The admission will be revived only after due consideration after Disciplinary Committee, paying Rs. 1000/– as revival fee

- iii) When a student indulges in breaking or damaging College property or other student's/teacher's property, fine will be imposed accordingly to the damage caused.
- 4. Suspension or issue of Transfer Certificate (TC)

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Anti-Ragging and Disciplinary committee looks after the overall student discipline as per Honorable Supreme Court order. Any incident of indiscipline is brought to the purview of the Disciplinary Committee. The Committee conducts enquiry and submits report to the Principal, who takes appropriate action as per the rules.

LIBRARY FACILITY

- 1. The library is open on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.
- 2. Library cards issued to students are not transferable.
- 3. The students shall be responsible for the book borrowed on his/her card.
- 4. Marking, underlining, annotating anywhere in the book are strictly forbidden.

- 5. Each student can borrow not more than two books at a time. The books must be returned or renewed within two weeks time.
- 6. A student failing to return the books after two weeks from the date of issue will be fined 50 paise per book per working day from the third week onwards.
- 7. Readers/ borrowers shall be responsible for any damage of books or other properties of the library and shall be required to replace the books or properties at their own cost. In case replacement is not possible, cost of the books or other property lost, damaged or injured is payable by the reader as follows:
 - a) Double the current value of the book/property.
- 8. The Librarian reserves the right to recall the book at any time.
- 9. Students shall not carry any book or printed matter into the library.
- 10. Strict silence should be observed in the library. No discussion is allowed in the library.

BOOK BANK SCHEME

Our college library is facilitated with the "Book Bank Scheme" for the welfare of Scheduled Castes Students. Each Student has the facility of taking two more books in addition to the usual two books. He /She can retain the books till the end of each semester. He /She can take another two books only after returning the books which were already taken.

N.C.C (NAVAL WING)

NCC Navy wing of the college was raised in 2008 and is affiliated with 1(P) NAVAL UNIT NCC. It is a mixed wing of Senior Division (SD) boys and Senior Wing (SW) girls. Cadets from the institution attend various training and achievement camps like Republic Day Parade held on 26th January at New Delhi (topmost achievement camp in Navy). The cadets write their 'B' and 'C' Certificate exams in their II and III years, respectively. Every year it enrolls around 17 cadets from the volunteers based on discipline, commitment and physical fitness.

N.S.S (NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME)

To motivate social conduct and to inculcate discipline among students, the NSS is functioning under a programme officer. Activities like blood donation, cleaning of campus, planting saplings, anti pollution campaign, AIDS awareness programme, etc. are being organized regularly.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

A sprawling ground is available inside the College Campus. The department provides facility to impart Physical training for men / women students in order build up team and competitive spirit. It helps the students to participate in various national, intercollegiate sports competitions. Students are encouraged to participate in sports. Timings for coaching goes beyond college hours.

DEPARTMENT ASSOCIATIONS

The different Department Associations of our college show keen interest in various co-curricular activities. Intellectual meetings like seminars, conferences, workshops, invited lectures and so on are conducted on a regular basis by these Associations.

CAREER GUIDANCE & COUNSELLING CELL

The Career guidance & Counselling cell functions effectively in this college. It has done a lot of work such as conduct of skill development workshop and placement activities for the benefit of final year students. Every year, the cell conducts campus interviews, entrepreneurial development programmes and skill development workshops.
