





F) What subject area are you currently pursuing? 144 responses




G) How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 144 responses




H) How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 144 responses




I) How well were the teachers able to communicate? 144 responses




J) The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as $^{\rm 144\,responses}$



K) Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 144 responses




L) Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 144 responses




M)The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.




N) The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.




O) The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 144 responses




P) Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, courseoutcomes and programme outcomes.






R) The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 144 responses




S) The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providingright level of challenges. 144 responses




T) Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. 144 responses












Y) What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

ANALYSIS OF THE REPORT (Student Satisfaction Survey 2023-2024)

Rajiv Gandhi Arts and Science College has established a proper system of obtaining regular feedback from the students since 2016. The Feedback has been obtained from the students of all the five courses. The Student-Satisfaction Survey (2023-2024) has been taken through online mode through Google Forms. The questionnaire was prepared in a manner so that the students could express their opinions, and propose their suggestions for the betterment of the system of the Institution, which includes Teaching, Mentor-Mentee System, Completion of syllabus, etc. The IQAC Committee has analysed the response of the students as follows:

The students show a high degree of positive responses regarding the studentteacher interaction and also the quality of their teaching. Like the previous year, the students have expressed a high degree of satisfaction regarding the studentsteacher interaction and the availability of teachers for guidance and monitoring and counselling both during College hours and if necessary after college hours. Some concerns however, were raised by students regarding internet connectivity issues, and several students have expressed the opinion that comprehensibility of the lessons in offline classes, communication of teachers is effective. They have expressed that the internal evaluation process is always fairly done. They also show their satisfaction towards the institution that shows interest in experiential learning by promoting internship, field visit opportunities for the students. The students also show their expectation towards multiple opportunities that should be provided to learn and grow beyond the syllabus.

They have also exhibited that the institution shows interest in encouraging the students to participate in extracurricular activities. It is also noted from the students' feedback that the ICT tools such as LCD Projector, Multimedia, etc are to a great percentage used by the teachers. The summary of the feedback obtained from the students have been forwarded to the College authority for necessary actions.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT : 2023-2024

IQAC has taken efforts to get feedback (Survey) from the students for the overall development of the college. The entire process of taking and analysing the Survey has been done by the IQAC Committee. A consolidated report has been duly submitted to the college authority for taking necessary action. The report of Survey is made available on the college website.

Feedback on the parameters viz. Teaching Learning Process, Teacher Student Relationship, Mentor-Mentee system, Experiential Learning, Extra Curricular Activities, etc. have been taken. Suggestions for overall development of the College have also been taken. 5 Point scale has been set for taking the feedback with 5th grade as Excellent/strongly agree, etc. Input of the feedback has been represented by using Pie chart diagram. A consolidated report has been duly submitted to the college authority for taking necessary action.T he report of feedback is made available on the college website.

Through the Mentor-Mentee system many students have got counselling (personal and academic) for their development. Counselling for the students have also been given to the students who are willing by our College Counsellors. Placement has been done every academic year and the report has been given in the specified criteria. Many Seminars, Guest Lectures and Training Programmes have been organised for the students and the respective reports have been uploaded in the Criterion III. The students are given opportunities to go for Internships, Industrial Visit, Field Visits etc. to develop their experiential learning. The detailed report is available in Criteria III.

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
